

Choctaw Nation (1850-1907)

This map illustrates the historical districts of the Choctaw Nation in Oklahoma, spanning from 1850 to 1907. 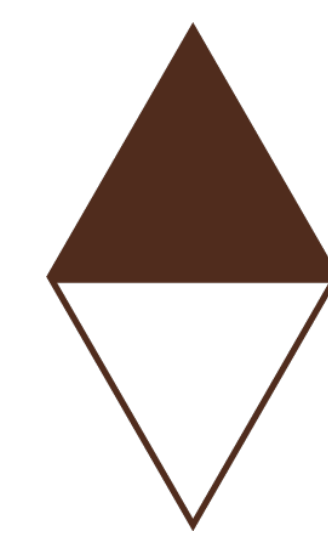
