

TO APPROVE THE DISPOSAL OF SURPLUS CAPITAL ASSETS

IN THE TRIBAL COUNCIL OF THE CHOCTAW NATION

RONALD PERRY INTRODUCED THE FOLLOWING COUNCIL BILL

A COUNCIL BILL

TO APPROVE the disposal of vehicles, furniture, fixtures or equipment with an original cost of \$499,582.56, a net book value of \$16,065.68, and a fair-market value of \$105,706.00, including all listed inventory as attached.

TO APPROVE the disposal of vehicles, furniture, fixtures and/or equipment with an original cost of \$797,163.09, a net book value of \$10,278.59, and a fair-market value of \$80,754.53.

WHEREAS, in accordance with Article IX, Sections 4 and 6 of the Constitution of the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma (the "Nation"), the Choctaw Tribal Council (the "Council") shall enact rule and regulations for the general good of the Nation, and for the administration and regulation of the affairs of the Nation, and shall make decisions pertaining to the acquisition, leasing, disposition and management of tribal property;

WHEREAS, the Nation has surplus inventory items that need to be disposed of in accordance with FA-101 Policy;

WHEREAS, the Nation has capital assets that are broken, obsolete, have exceeded their useful life, or simply no longer have a use to the Nation;

WHEREAS, the Fixed Assets Department desires to dispose of said excess equipment in the most cost-effective manner possible, with the net proceeds from any sale being returned to the program, as stated on the attachment, when applicable;

WHEREAS, the original cost of the equipment and/or fixtures was \$499,582.56 and currently has a net book value of \$16,065.68 and a fair market value of \$105,706.00. See Exhibit A;

WHEREAS, the original costs of the equipment and/or fixtures was \$797,163.09, and currently has a net book value of \$10,278.59, and a fair-market value of \$80,754.53. See Exhibit B; and

WHEREAS, the Council has determined it is in the best interest of the Nation to approve of the disposal of equipment listed in Exhibit A and Exhibit B and approve the net proceeds of the sale of the equipment be returned to the program.

THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED by the Tribal Council of the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma that this Bill be cited as approval for the Fixed Assets Department to dispose of all vehicles, furniture, fixtures and/or equipment listed in Exhibits A and B, in the most cost-effective manner possible and in accordance with Choctaw Nation FA-101 Policy.
