

**TO APPROVE THE RETENTION OF PROFESSOR JACK F. WILLIAMS AS AN
ADVISOR TO THE TRIBAL COUNCIL OF THE CHOCTAW NATION OF
OKLAHOMA**

IN THE TRIBAL COUNCIL OF THE CHOCTAW NATION

RONALD PERRY INTRODUCED THE FOLLOWING COUNCIL BILL

A COUNCIL BILL

TO APPROVE the retention of Professor Jack F. Williams (“Professor Williams”) as an advisor to the Tribal Council of the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma.

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma (“Council”) has selected Professor Williams, to serve as an advisor to the Council;

WHEREAS, Professor Williams will assist the Council by providing advisory guidance, scholarly research, and writing services for the Council on matters the Council deems to be of importance to the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma (the “Nation”), provided that Professor Williams shall have no authority to bind the Choctaw Nation, or Council, in any contract or contractual relationship;

WHEREAS, the Council has agreed to retain Professor Williams for a term of one (1) year;

WHEREAS, the Council has agreed to pay Professor Williams one dollar (\$1) per year and reasonable travel costs, subject to the laws, policies, and procedures of the Nation; and

WHEREAS, the Council finds it is in the best interest of the Nation to retain Professor Williams as an advisor to the Council.

THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED by the Tribal Council of the Choctaw Nation that this Bill be cited as approval to retain Professor Williams, as an advisor to the Tribal Council of the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma.

BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, by the Tribal Council of the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma that Professor Williams shall provide advisory guidance, scholarly research, and writing for the Council on matters the Council deems to be of importance to the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma,

BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, by the Tribal Council of the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma that Professor Williams shall have no authority to bind the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma, or Tribal Council, in any contract or contractual relationship.

BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, by the Tribal Council of the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma that the Tribal Council shall retain Professor Williams as an advisor to the Tribal Council for a term of

one (1) year, beginning on the date this bill is approved, with rights to terminate at by either party, at any time.

BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, by the Tribal Council of the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma that Professor Williams be paid one dollar (\$1) per year and reasonable travel costs, subject to the laws, policies, and procedures of the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma, to act as an advisor to the Tribal Council.



Purpose/Need of Council Bill: This bill approves the retention of Professor Jack F. Williams, PhD, JD, CIRA, CDBV, as Tribal Council advisor. Professor Williams will provide advisory guidance, scholarly research, and writing services to Tribal Council. The Tribal Council will retain Professor Williams for one year and pay \$1 a year plus reasonable travel costs subject to the Nation's rules, policies, and procedures.
