A COUNCIL BILL

TO APPROVE application to the United States Department of Health and Human Services for a grant offered through Title VI Part A and Title VI Part C of the Older Americans Act.


WHEREAS, the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma realizes the need to meet the needs of Native American elders; and

WHEREAS, funds from the United States Department of Health and Human Services will assist the Choctaw Nation in providing nutritional meals, information and assistance, transportation, and caregiving services to elder Choctaw Nation members.


THEREFORE BE IT ENACTED by the Tribal Council of the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma that this Bill be cited as approval to make application to the United States Department of Health and Human Services for Title VI Part A and Title VI Part C.

CERTIFICATION

Title VI Part A and Part C Budget

The funding amount for each Title VI award is based on the number of elder 60+ receiving services in your community. The award amounts are determined using a formula grant that is based on the number of elders served and allocation of funds. Although you can estimate the anticipated amount that your tribe will receive the amount could be a few dollars more or less. You will not know the final award amount until the grant specialist calculates the formula based on your submission and you receive your notice of award letter.
