A COUNCIL BILL


TO APPROVE the FY/14 budget of the Choctaw Nation Environmental office water pollution control program funded by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency.


WHEREAS, the Choctaw Nation Environmental Office desires to conduct water monitoring activities in the Kiamichi River basin.


THEREFORE BE IT ENACTED by the Tribal Council of the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma that this Act be cited as approval for the FY14 budget for the Choctaw Nation Environmental Office Water Pollution Control Program Cooperative Agreement #00F74501 for the amount of \$75,978 under the conditions described herein.
