TO APPROVE AMENDMENT TO CB-113-96, A COUNCIL BILL REGULATING POLITICAL
ACTIVITIES ON THE COUNCIL GROUNDS AT TUSKAHOMA

IN THE TRIBAL COUNCIL OF THE CHOCTAW NATION

ANTHONY DILLARD INTRODUCED THE FOLLOWING COUNCIL BILL

A COUNCIL BILL

TO APPROVE Amending Council Bill CB-113-96, also known as the Council Bill Regulating Political Activities on the Council Grounds at Tuskahoma.

WHEREAS, the Constitution of the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma requires the Tribal Council to pass all laws and regulations of the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma; and


WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the Nation that the Tribal Council of the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma regulate political activities on the council grounds at Tuskahoma; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the Nation that CB-113-96 be amended and enacted as attached herein.

THEREFORE BE IT ENACTED by the Tribal Council of the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma that this Amendment be cited as approval for change to the Council Bill Regulating Political Activities on the Council Grounds at Tuskahoma as enacted in CB-113-96 and as approval of the provisions as amended and attached herein.

Regulation of Political Activities on the Council Grounds at Tuskahoma

Be it enacted by the Tribal Council of the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma that political activities on the council grounds at Tuskahoma shall be governed by this act as follows:

1. Any person, group of persons or organization desiring to engage in political activity or advocacy for a particular cause shall:
 - a. At least thirty (30) days prior to Labor Day Monday, each year, register with and obtain a permit to do so from the Labor Day Festival Committee (Committee);
 - b. Any such permit issued shall allow for political activities beginning at 12:00PM on the Thursday preceding Labor Day and shall expire on Labor Day Monday at 5:00PM;
 - c. Be assigned an area, on an as available basis, not to exceed ten (10) feet by ten (10) feet in size;
 - d. Confine all political activities, including distribution of literature and materials, campaigning or other advocacy to the assigned area;
 - e. Refrain from engaging in loud or offensive conduct which disturbs the peace of other persons on the council grounds;
 - f. Display the permit at all times on the assigned area when it is in use;
 - g. Keep the assigned area clean and free of litter and debris; and
 - h. Obey all laws of the Choctaw Nation.
2. The committee, at its sole discretion, shall determine the location of assigned areas.
3. The committee may, for good cause, deny or revoke any permit and may, at its discretion, waive the deadline in paragraph 1(a).
4. No permit shall be granted to any person, group of persons or organization for the purpose of dissemination of indecent or pornographic information.

**A Council Bill Regulating Political Activities
on the Council Grounds at Tuskahoma**

IN THE TRIBAL COUNCIL OF THE CHOCTAW NATION

A COUNCIL BILL

Be it enacted by the Tribal Council of the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma that political activities on the council grounds at Tuskahoma shall be governed by this act as follows:


1. Any person, group of persons or organization desiring to engage in political activity or advocacy for a particular cause shall:
 - (a) On or before August 15, each year, register with and obtain a one year permit to do so from the Labor Day Festival Committee (Committee);
 - (b) Be assigned an area, on an as available basis, not to exceed ten (10) feet by ten (10) feet in size;
 - (c) Confine all political activities, including distribution of literature and materials, campaigning or other advocacy to the assigned area;
 - (d) Refrain from engaging in loud or offensive conduct which disturbs the peace of other persons on the council grounds.
 - (e) Display the permit at all times on the assigned area when it is in use;
 - (f) Keep the assigned area clean and free of litter and debris; and
 - (g) Obey all laws of the Choctaw Nation.


2. The committee, at its sole discretion, shall determine the location of assigned areas.
3. The committee may, for good cause, deny or revoke any permit and may, at its discretion, waive the deadline in paragraph 1(a).
4. No permit shall be granted to any person, group of persons or organization for the purpose of dissemination of indecent or pornographic information.
5. Failure to comply with the provisions of this act shall constitute a crime punishable by imprisonment not to exceed ninety (90) days and/or a fine not to exceed \$500.
