




COLLEGE FRESHMAN YEAR INITIATIVE







PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

2022 - 2023

The Chiefs Leadership Class is a one year only program designed to advance leadership skills, cultural knowledge, and personal/professional development. College FYI is working diligently with Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma leaders and associates to provide a valuable experience for our outstanding Choctaw college students.

Students must have a minimum 2.5 GPA, Junior or Senior status, participated in the College FYI program, and enrolled full time for the fall semester at an accredited university. Students receive \$1000 scholarship upon attending summer and winter retreats.


HOPE TOLIVER
