Chapter 10: Immi Isht Anoli - Possessive Pronouns (m-form)

Lesson 2: Model I Sentences

Starter: Students will give the greeting, day of the week, month, date, and weather in Choctaw.

Objective: Students will learn Model I Sentences with the possessive pronoun “*vm* - my.” Students will learn that the m-form possessive pronouns come before words that begin with a vowel.

Presentation: Model I Sentences

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| a) <i>Vm</i> ofi <i>yvt</i> balili. | a) My dog is running. |
| b) <i>Vm</i> abinili <i>yvt</i> hikia. | b) My chair is standing. |
| c) <i>Vlla</i> tek <i>mvt</i> <i>vm</i> isht ishko <i>ishi</i> . | c) That girl has my cup. |
| d) <i>Vm</i> issuba <i>pisa</i> tuk. | d) (He) saw my horse. |

Activity: SENTENCE COMPLETION/TRANSLATION

Teacher will show pictures and student will provide the m-form possessive pronoun to say, “*vm* - my”. Repeat several times until students are at ease. Students will repeat Model I Sentences and give its translation. Students will complete and translate sentences using the possessive pronoun “*vm* - my.”

Closure: Teacher will call on students at random to give the Choctaw possessive pronoun *vm* with the name of pictures.
