

## SENTENCE COMPLETION/TRANSLATION

Using the possessive pronoun “im - his/her/its,” complete the sentence and translate. Note: In translation you start with the possessive pronoun.

Example: Im ofi yvt aboha anuka ia tuk. His dog went in the house.

1. Im *okhisa* yvt *tiwa* kiyo. (door)  
*His/Her door is not open.*
2. Im *akaka* yvt *kanchvk homma bilika hikia* tuk. (chicken)  
*His/Her chicken was standing near the red barn.*
3. Im *ilefoka* yvt *bok anuka ittonla* tuk. (clothes)  
*His/Her clothes were lying in the river.*
4. Im *ofi* yvt *palvska vpa* tuk. (dog)  
*His/Her dog ate the bread.*
5. Im *oka* yvt *kapvssa* kiyo. (water)  
*His/Her water is not cold.*
6. Im *isht holissochi* yvt *yushkololi*. (pencil)  
*His/Her pencil is short.*
7. Im *issuba* yvt *bok anuka hikia*. (horse)  
*His/Her horse is standing in the river.*
8. Im *abinili* yvt *lakna*. (chair)  
*His/Her chair is yellow.*
9. Im *issuba* yvt *lusa micha tohbi*. (horse)  
*His/Her horse is white and black.*
10. Im *ohoyo* yvt *hopona hinla*. (woman; wife)  
*His woman; wife can cook.*
11. Im *alich* yvt *takkon homma vpa* tuk. (doctor)  
*His/Her doctor ate a red apple.*
12. Im *iti* yvt *okchamali micha chaha*. (tree)  
*His/Her tree is tall and green.*
