- d) A towa lakna ishi tuk.

- a) My shoes are wet.
- b) My house is white.
- c) The teacher ate my apple.
- d) (He) had my yellow ball.

Activity: TRANSLATIONS

Teacher will flash pictures of objects and students will prefix the name of the picture with "<u>a</u> - my" (nasal form) showing personal ownership. Students will repeat Model I Sentences until familiar with the sentence structure.

Closure: Teacher will read model sentences and have students give translation in English.
