Lesson 2: Model I Sentences

Starter: Students will give the greeting, day of the week, month, date, and weather in Choctaw.

Objective: Students will learn that the nasal form of the possessive pronouns will come before words that begin with a consonant.

Activity: TRANSLATIONS

Teacher will flash pictures of objects and students will prefix the name of the picture with “a - my” (nasal form) showing personal ownership. Students will repeat Model I Sentences until familiar with the sentence structure.

Closure: Teacher will read model sentences and have students give translation in English.
