Starter: Students will give the greeting, day of the week, month, date, and weather in Choctaw.

Objective: Students will learn the nasal form of the possessive pronouns come before words that begin with a consonant.

Presentation: Model 2 Sentences

- a) Chi katos vt hushi hokli tuk.
- b) Chi nan ola yvt iskitini.
- c) Vlla nakni mvt ch<u>i</u> shvpo bvnna.
- d) Chi tvmaha ia tuk.

- a) Your cat caught a bird.
- b) Your radio is small.
- c) That boy wants your hat.
- d) (She) went to your town.

Activity: TRANSLATIONS

Teacher will show pictures and students will provide the nasal form possessive pronoun "chi" to show personal ownership. Repeat several times until students can quickly give the correct form of ownership with the pictures. Students will repeat Model 2 Sentences to expand their use of the pronoun "chi."

Closure: Teacher will call on students randomly to give the Choctaw possessive pronoun "ch<u>i</u>" with the name of the pictures as they are flashed.
