Chapter 6: Hohchifo Vlhtoba **Lesson 3:** Model 2 Sentences

Starter: Students will give the greeting, day of the week, month, date, and weather in Choctaw.

Objective: Students will be introduced to Model 2 Sentences and past tense marker 'tuk.' To show past tense the word 'tuk' is added to the end of a sentence.

Example sentence: Of i yvt impa. The dog is eating.

Past tense sentence: Ofi yvt impa tuk. The dog ate.

Presentation: Model 2 Sentences

- a) Issi nipi hoponi li tuk.

 a) I cooked venison.
- b) Issi nipi ish hoponi tuk.b) You cooked venison.c) Issi nipi hoponi tuk.d) You cooked venison.e) (He/She/It) cooked venison.

Activity 1: Student will repeat these modeled sentences until they are familiar with the Choctaw past tense marker at the end of a sentence. Students will continue to review 'li' and 'ish' in these sentence structures.

Activity 2: WHO COOKED?

This activity will review Model 2 Sentences and reinforce the past tense marker 'tuk.'

Closure: Teacher will read sentences from the student worksheet in English and students will read back the corresponding sentence in Choctaw.
