## CHAHTA ANUMPA II Chapter One—Lesson 3

Chapter 1: Yvmmvt nanta?Lesson 3: Model 2 Sentences

**Starter:** Students will give the greeting, date, and weather. Students will engage in dialogue with a prepared question and give impromptu responses.

Speaker I: Palvska champuli hvpi bvnna h<u>o</u>? Speaker 2: Allow for individual response.

**Objective:** Students will learn Model 2 sentences and the use of the plural subject pronouns.

**Skills to Teach:** The subject pronouns sv, chi, hvpi, and hvchi—used with the word 'bvnna' are the same markers used to show emotions/feelings. Ex: Sv nukshopa. I am afraid. They are NOT expressed with (is, am, was, were...) as with emotion/feelings.

These markers take a subject pronoun and a direct object.

<u>Singular</u>		
lst person	sv bvnna	I want
2nd person	chi bvnna	you want
3rd person	bvnna	(he, she, it) wants
Plural		
lst person	pi bvnna	we want
lst person	hvpi bvnna	we (all) want
2nd person	hvchi bvnna	you (all) want
3rd person	bunna	(they) want

Okla is used before a verb. To understand plurality 'okla' can be used before bunna to mean 'they'.

Example: Okla oka bunna. (They want water.)

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## Presentation of new material: Model 2 Sentences

a) Palvska champuli vpa sv bvnna.	a) I want to eat cake.
b) Nanta chi bʊnna?	b) What do you want?
c) Wak nipi hưchi bưnna h <u>o</u> ?	c) Do you (all) want beef?
d) Keyu, ak <u>a</u> k nipi hvpi bvnna.	d) No, we (all) want chicken.

**Activity:** MULTIPLE CHOICE: NANTA CHI BUNNA? WHAT DO YOU WANT? Students will read a Choctaw sentence and pick from a choice of three English sentences that translates the Choctaw sentence.

**Closure:** Teacher will read from the MULTIPLE CHOICE WORKSHEET English sentences and ask the class as a group to translate into Choctaw.

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
