- c) No, our dad didn't buy food for it.
- b) P<u>i</u> shukha <u>i</u> hohchifo yvt Pok Chap.
- d) Our pig's name is Pork Chop.

Activity: VOCABULARY/TRANSLATIONS/MATCHING

Students will practice pronunciation of vocabulary words and practice word meanings with a word clue activity and translating noun phrases.

Closure: Students will write for three minutes Choctaw sentences using as many of the vocabulary words as they can remember.
