Lesson 2: Model I Sentences

| b) Onnahinlikma tvmaha ia <u>chi</u> . | b) He will go to town in the morning. |
| c) Tabokoli kash ish impa tuk <u>o</u> ? | c) Did you eat at noon? |
| d) Okkiakma impa la <u>chi</u> . | d) I will eat this evening. |

Activity: VOCABULARY WORD CLUE/SENTENCE MATCHING

Students will write correct terms for clues given in a sentence and choose correct English sentences that translate the Choctaw sentences.

Closure: Teacher will say terms for time and students will respond with either the words a.m. or p.m. to indicate the correct reference of time.
