d) Where does your sister live?

Activity: VOCABULARY/TRANSLATIONS

Students will identify the underlined possessive pronoun and translate the sentence to English.

Closure: Teacher will review skills by asking students to number from 1 - 8 on a blank sheet of paper. Teacher will call out eight possessive pronouns in Choctaw and students will write its English meaning.
