### TO APPROVE APPLICATION FOR THE FY23 TRIBAL MATERNAL, INFANT, AND EARLY CHILDHOOD HOME VISITING PROGRAM IMPLEMENTATION AND EXPANSION GRANTS

#### IN THE TRIBAL COUNCIL OF THE CHOCTAW NATION

#### RONALD PERRY INTRODUCED THE FOLLOWING COUNCIL BILL

#### A COUNCIL BILL

**TO APPROVE** the application to the United States Department of Health and Human Services Administration for Children and Families FY23 Tribal Maternal, Infant, and Early Childhood Home Visiting Program: Implementation and Expansion Grant Program (TMIECHV).

WHEREAS, in accordance with the Constitution of the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma Article IX, Section 4: "The Tribal Council shall enact legislation, rules and regulations not inconsistent with this Constitution for the general good of the Choctaw Nation and for the administration and regulation of the affairs of the Choctaw Nation.";

WHEREAS, the Choctaw Nation (the "Nation") recognizes the need to sustain and expand early childhood development services to families pregnant with or parenting a Native American child with an age range from birth to three (3) years old within the sovereign territory. The goal of the program is to improve coordination of services for at-risk pregnant women, expectant fathers, young children and families;

WHEREAS, the maximum federal budget is \$7,500,000.00 over 5 years;

WHEREAS, the Nation will not provide a match;

**WHEREAS**, funds for the TMIECHV grant will be used to improve coordination of services for at-risk pregnant women, expectant fathers, young children and families;

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has determined it is in the best interest of the Nation to approve the application to the United States Department of Health and Human Services Administration for Children and Families for the FY23 Tribal Maternal, Infant, and Early Childhood Home Visiting Program: Implementation and Expansion Grant Program in order to expand and improve early childhood development services for at-risk pregnant women, expectant fathers, young children and families within the Nation's sovereign territory; and

WHEREAS, this Council Bill furthers the Nation's strategic goal of supporting service delivery to tribal members by allowing for expanded and improved early childhood development services to at-risk pregnant women, expectant fathers, young children and families within the Nation's sovereign territory.

**THEREFORE BE IT ENACTED** by the Tribal Council of the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma that this Bill be cited as approval to apply to the United States Department of Health and Human Services Administration for Children and Families for the FY23 Tribal Maternal, Infant, and Early Childhood Home Visiting Program: Implementation and Expansion Grant Program for a maximum federal award of Seven Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars and 00/100 (\$7,500,000.00) with no match.

**BE IT FURTHER ENACTED** by the Tribal Council of the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma that this Bill be cited as an acknowledgement that the Chief of the Nation, or his designee, is authorized to prepare, execute, deliver and file any and all agreements, certificates, instruments and documents, in such form and with such terms and provisions as the Chief of the Nation, or his designee, may approve, and to take such other action as he, she or they may deem proper or appropriate, to carry out the intent and purposes of the foregoing enactments.
