#### IN THE TRIBAL COUNCIL OF THE CHOCTAW NATION

#### RONALD PERRY INTRODUCED THE FOLLOWING COUNCIL BILL

#### A COUNCIL BILL

**TO APPROVE** the application to the United States Department of Health and Human Services, Center for Disease Control for the FY23 Strengthening Public Health Systems and Services in Indian Country Grant (SPHSSIC).

WHEREAS, in accordance with Article IX, Section 4 of the Constitution of the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma, "The Tribal Council shall enact legislation, rules and regulations not inconsistent with this Constitution for the general good of the Choctaw Nation and for the administration and regulation of the affairs of the Choctaw Nation";

WHEREAS, the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma (the "Nation") recognizes the need to develop and maintain a diverse public health workforce by providing additional training and professional development opportunities for the Nation's Public Health Department staff. This program will also initiate a school-based youth health program focused on Sexually Transmitted Infection/HIV and smoking/e-cigarette intervention and cessation;

WHEREAS, the maximum federal budget is \$1,000,000.00 over 5 years;

WHEREAS, the Nation will not provide a match;

WHEREAS, funds for the SPHSSIC grant will meet the Nation's Strategic Goal to support service delivery to improve quality of life through health education, health promotion and disease prevention; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has determined it is in the best interest of the Nation to approve the application to the United States Department of Health and Human Services, Center for Disease Control for the FY23 Strengthening Public Health Systems and Services in Indian Country Grant in order to add training and professional development opportunities for the Nation's Public Health Department staff, as well as to initiate a school-based youth health program for STI/HIV & smoking/e-cigarette intervention and cessation.

**THEREFORE BE IT ENACTED** by the Tribal Council of the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma that this Bill be cited as approval to apply to the United States Department of Health and Human Services, Center for Disease Control for FY23 Strengthening Public Health Systems and Services in Indian Country (SPHSSIC) grant for a maximum federal award of One Million Dollars and 00/100 (\$1,000,000.00) with no match.

**BE IT FURTHER ENACTED** by the Tribal Council of the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma that this Bill be cited as an acknowledgement that the Chief of the Nation, or his designee, is authorized to prepare, execute, deliver and file any and all agreements, certificates, instruments and documents, in such form and with such terms and provisions as the Chief of the Nation, or his designee, may approve, and to take such other action as he, she or they may deem proper or appropriate, to carry out the intent and purposes of the foregoing enactments.
