# TO APPROVE APPLICATION FOR THE FY24 COMMUNITY OPIOID INTERVENTION PREVENTION PROGRAM

### IN THE TRIBAL COUNCIL OF THE CHOCTAW NATION

### RONALD PERRY INTRODUCED THE FOLLOWING COUNCIL BILL

#### A COUNCIL BILL

**TO APPROVE** application to the United States Department of Health and Human Services Indian Health Service for the FY24 Community Opioid Intervention Prevention Program.

WHEREAS, the Choctaw Nation (the "Nation") recognizes the value of continuing the previously funded FY21 Community Opioid Intervention Program (COIPP);

WHEREAS, the maximum federal budget is \$500,000.00 per budget period for 5 years for a maximum award of \$2,500,000.00 with no tribal match; and

WHEREAS, funds for the FY24 COIPP grant are a continuation of the FY21 COIPP grant program. Funds for COIPP provide community education regarding medication-assisted treatment (MAT) services and the development/planning of culturally specific curriculum with residents of the Nation's Chi Hullo Li Residential Treatment Center.

**THEREFORE BE IT ENACTED** by the Tribal Council of the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma that this Bill be cited as approval to apply to the United States Department of Health and Human Servies Indian Health Service for the FY24 Community Opioid Intervention Prevention Program for a maximum federal award of Two Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars and 00/100 (\$2,500,000.00) with no tribal match.

**BE IT FURTHER ENACTED** by the Council that this Bill be cited as an acknowledgement that the Chief of the Nation, or his designee, is authorized to prepare, execute, deliver and file any and all agreements, certificates, instruments and documents, in such form and with such terms and provisions as the Chief of the Nation, or his designee, may approve, and to take such other action as he, she or they may deem proper or appropriate, to carry out the intent and purposes of the foregoing enactments.
