

TO APPROVE PINE TELEPHONE’S APPLICATION FOR THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE 2024 RURAL ECONNECTIVITY (RECONNECT) PROGRAM

IN THE TRIBAL COUNCIL OF THE CHOCTAW NATION

RONALD PERRY INTRODUCED THE FOLLOWING COUNCIL BILL

A COUNCIL BILL

TO APPROVE consent and support for Pine Telephone’s application to the United States Department of Agriculture Rural eConnectivity (ReConnect) Program to provide broadband access within the Choctaw Nation Reservation.

WHEREAS, Article IX, Section 4 of the Constitution of the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma (the “Nation”) provides that the Tribal Council (the “Council”) shall enact legislation, rules and regulations not inconsistent with the Constitution for the general good of the Choctaw Nation and for the administration and regulation of the affairs of the Choctaw Nation;

WHEREAS, the Choctaw Nation (the “Nation”) realizes the need to expand broadband infrastructure on tribal lands increasing access to and adoption of broadband by citizens to increase quality of life and services;

WHEREAS, Pine Telephone is eligible for funding to provide broadband infrastructure deployment including new infrastructure, replacing or upgrading existing infrastructure and equipment, and extending existing infrastructure and services with Federal funds within the Choctaw Nation Reservation;

WHEREAS, in order to receive said federal funding, the Nation must enact legislation showing its consent and support for Pine Telephone to perform this work within the Choctaw Nation Reservation; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma has determined it is in the best interest of the Nation to provide its consent and support for Pine Telephone’s application to the United States Department of Agriculture for the 2024 Rural eConnectivity (ReConnect) Program in order to provide broadband access/service within the Choctaw Nation Reservation.

THEREFORE BE IT ENACTED by the Tribal Council of the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma that this Bill be cited as the Nation’s consent to the Federal Communications Commission for Pine Telephone’s application to the United States Department of Agriculture for the 2024 Rural eConnectivity (ReConnect) Program in order to provide broadband access/service within the Choctaw Nation Reservation.


CERTIFICATION

Purpose/Need of Council Bill: Pine Telephone is eligible for funding to provide broadband infrastructure deployment, including new infrastructure, replacing or upgrading existing infrastructure and equipment, and extending existing infrastructure and services with Federal funds within the Choctaw Nation Reservation. In order to receive this federal funding, the Nation must enact legislation showing its consent and support for Pine Telephone to perform this work within the Choctaw Nation Reservation. This bill meets the Nation's strategic goal of achieving digital transformation to be strategically positioned in the digital economy through access to broadband.
