

**A RESOLUTION TO APPROVE THE NOMINATION OF DR. JASON REGAN TO SERVE
ON THE U.S. PREVENTIVE SERVICES TASK FORCE**

A COUNCIL RESOLUTION

TO APPROVE a Resolution supporting the nomination of Dr. Jason Regan, Choctaw tribal member and Choctaw Nation Health Services Authority Physician, for appointment to serve on the U.S. Preventive Services Task Force (USPSTF) as a representative of the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma.

WHEREAS, the Secretary of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services seeks nominations to the USPSTF;

WHEREAS, in accordance with Article VII, Section 2 of the Constitution of the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma (the "Nation"), the Chief has the power to "establish and appoint committees, members and delegates to represent the Choctaw Nation with the advice and consent of the Tribal Council.";

WHEREAS, Chief Gary Batton nominates Dr. Jason Regan for appointment to the USPSTF to represent the Nation, our Choctaw tribal members and other tribes' citizens served through the Choctaw Nation Health Services Authority, and to be a voice for healthcare in Indian Country on this national task force;

WHEREAS, Dr. Regan's education and expertise make him a great fit for this role, as well as his ongoing commitment to serving those who need assistance the most, as well as his commitment to helping people live healthy lifestyles;

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the Nation supports efforts to build and grow our relationship with the U.S. Secretary of Health and Human Services, other healthcare providers, and other tribal health departments around the country to grow, develop, and support our healthcare endeavors and help our tribal members improve their quality of life and live healthy lifestyles;


WHEREAS, Dr. Regan is highly qualified and equipped to serve on this committee. He is a tribal member serving his own community, and has been a physician at our Choctaw Nation hospital for more than 20 years. He has taken on many leadership roles over the years, including playing a crucial role with our residency program to help train physicians for Indian Country and rural America. In addition to various teaching and leadership roles, Dr. Regan has maintained his position as an ER physician during his entire tenure with the Choctaw Nation. He is able to help address immediate needs in this role and help direct everyone served in the ER on the right path toward overall health and wellness;


